Montgomery County Medical Society Honors MobileMed and Five Public Health Advocates at Annual Meeting

Sewell Access to Care Award presented to primary care organization serving thousands of low-income adults; four recognized for advancing Medicaid access and public health

ROCKVILLE, Md. (April 29, 2026) — At its 123rd Installation of Officers & Annual Meeting on April 29, Montgomery County Medical Society (MCMS) presented awards recognizing outstanding contributions to enhancing healthcare access and public health in Montgomery County and across Maryland.

Webster Sewell, M.D. Access to Care Award: MobileMed

MobileMed (Mobile Medical Care, Inc.) received the 2026 [Webster Sewell, M.D. Access to Care Award](#), MCMS's annual recognition for individuals or organizations committed to improving healthcare access in the National Capital Region. The award is co-sponsored by the [National Capital Physicians Foundation](#).

MobileMed serves as a primary care medical home [for thousands of low-income adults](#) in Montgomery County, providing care “with compassion, respect, and cultural sensitivity” to patients regardless of their ability to pay. Services include primary care, vaccination, and chronic disease management for adults who otherwise lack access to consistent medical care.

The Sewell Award honors the legacy of Webster Sewell, M.D., who dedicated his professional career to expanding healthcare access in Montgomery County. The award is accompanied by a \$500 contribution to further the recipient’s mission. MobileMed accepts donations to support its work at mobilemedicalcare.org/donate.

Public Health Advocacy Awards

MCMS also honored five individuals whose work has meaningfully advanced public health and healthcare access in Montgomery County:

Delegate Emily Shetty (District 18) was recognized for her leadership on preserving Medicaid funding in the Maryland General Assembly, in her role as Chair of the Health & Social Services Subcommittee of Appropriations, the committee that oversees the entire Medicaid budget.

Kisha Davis, M.D., M.P.H., Montgomery County Chief Health Officer and President-Elect of the American Academy of Family Physicians, was recognized for her public health leadership in Montgomery County, with particular appreciation for her ongoing commitment to health equity and reducing disparities in care for the County's diverse communities.

Kathryn Kelly, M.D. (Internal Medicine), and Isha Misra, M.D. (Hospital Medicine), were honored for launching the MCMS Public Health Committee, clarifying its purposes and determining two major initiatives the Society will pursue in the realm of specialty physician access and enhancing transitions of care for patients who have been hospitalized.

Brent Berger, M.D., (Internal Medicine) was recognized for his contributions as the MCMS representative to the Montgomery County Commission on Health, that works directly with the Chief Health Officer and County leadership to provide input on policy and community health programs.
